A Helping Stone!

The word Ebenezer in Hebrew comes from two words, eben meaning stone, and ezer meaning help. We read Hebrew writing from right to left; therefore, Ebenezer means "helping stone." (1 Samuel 7:12 NKJV) Ebenezer Farm Road and Ebenezer Farm Circle flank our house and lot; therefore, our borders are a helping stone.

Last year, two young ladies drove their car with a flat tire into our neighborhood, stopping at our property. I changed their tire and sent them on with love and a word from the LORD.

Last month, a young man drove his Lexus into our neighborhood, stopping at our property. Exiting his car, he knelt on the street vomiting.
