falsely arrested and condemned him to death (Mark 14:55-59). Roman soldiers ripped flesh from his body and torn off pieces of his beard (John 19:1, Isaiah 50:6, 52:14). In a weakened condition, he walked a third of a mile and himself laid his beaten body on the stripe of a cross (John 19:17). Soldiers nailed his feet to the stripe and his hands to the patibulum, then suspended him between heaven and earth for nine hours (Mark 15:24). A heavy darkness fell onto the earth for three hours, while his body received all the past, present and future sins of humanity (Mathew 27:45-46). He looked at those standing beneath him and ask his father to forgive them (Luke 23:34). At three o'clock in the afternoon, he shouted, "Finished!" then committed his spirit to his father, hung his head, and died (John 19:30). Two of his friends buried his body in a borrowed tomb (John 19:38-42). In his spirit, Jesus went into hell and completed his defeat of Satan (Ephesians 4:8-9, Revelation 1:18). In three days, he rose from the dead, leaving our sins behind, and visited his disciples and friends, showing them his promise to return (Matthew 28:1-10, 16-17). Then he ascended into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God, his father (Acts 1:9-11). Jesus accomplished all the above in three years.
