A Language of Promise

A covenant has language that conveys a promise. However, a contract also includes a promise and a penalty if a promise to deliver something does not happen. An undelivered promise in a contract is a breach of contract. It is a game-changer. In the Old Covenant, God promised Abraham that he and his descendants would possess the land of Canaan (Genesis 12:7, 17:7-8, Exodus 6:7-8, NKJV). Notice that this covenant was between two, God and Abraham, and it did not stipulate an end date or any penalty for lack of performance. Neither did God tell Abraham he would inherit the land of Canaan because the testator of a legal will must die before the beneficiary can receive the promised inheritance. God cannot die; therefore, He does not give an inheritance; He gives a promise of a possession in a covenant (Hebrews 9:16-17). Marriage is a covenant between two people, a man and a woman. The man is in God's role as the spiritual leader of the union striving to fulfill marriage promises (Ephesians 5:25-31). The woman is in Jesus' role as one who helps her husband be the spiritual leader (Ephesians 5:22-24). God and Jesus Christ gave us a new covenant promise only they could fulfill. When we accept the gift Jesus paid for us, we have eternal life instead of eternal death (Matthew 26:28, Hebrews 9:14-15). Today, many people have rejected Jesus' gift. I implore you to accept the greatest gift of your life.
