Disbelief

As disbelief was prevalent in A.D. 1-35, we see its demonstration today. The rulers of Israel in A.D. 1-35 taught the people the traditions of the ruling fathers (Matthew 15:1-9, NKJV). Synagogue rulers excommunicated anyone violating the teachings (Matthew 18:15-17). The synagogue was the center of worship and social fellowship. Excommunication was a shunning of those who violated the teachings. When Jesus entered life and taught God's ways to the people, those who believed he was the Messiah suffered excommunication (John 9:22, 12:42-43). The teachings of the rulers had reversed God's ways. The rulers taught black is white and evil is good (John 8:1-59). Rulers rebelled when Jesus stopped their money laundering in the temple court (John 2:14-17, Mark 11:15-18). We see the same hostility today because of the cleansing of our country of financial fraud. The rulers condemned him for healing on the Sabbath (Matthew 12:10-14). We see the same hostility today through the abuse of believers on campuses and in the streets who share Jesus with unbelievers. Those who know nothing of the past do not know what is right for today, nor have any concept of the future. Therefore, they fall into disbelief. Shalom!!
