## **The True Lord's Prayer**

We have learned that Matthew 6:9-13 and Luke 11:2-4 (NKJV) hold the Lord's Prayer. It is really a prayer Jesus taught the disciples. John chapter 17 records the prayer Jesus prayed for his disciples and those who believe in him. This prayer occurred only hours before the Chief Priest's guards and Roman cohort arrested Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. The salient points of Jesus' prayer show his obedience to his Father, the glorification of his Father, the revelation of God in Jesus, the choosing of the twelve disciples, the disciples' mission, the disciples' unity modeled on Jesus' unity with God the Father, the believer's final destiny in the presence of the Father and Son. Jesus prayed for God to protect you, me, and all believers from Satan's works (John 17:15). He prayed all believers would become one with him, as he is with God (John 17:21). It is our job to believe God protects us (John 6:28-29). We should live in this world as if we are one with Jesus and God the Father. No evil can touch us (Psalm 91:4-8). God alone is our healer and provides all we need and want (Luke 6:19; Philippians 4:19; Psalm 23:1). Jesus did not pray for the world (John 17:9). Therefore, non-believers do not have these blessings. Now is the time for your salvation (Acts 3:19).
