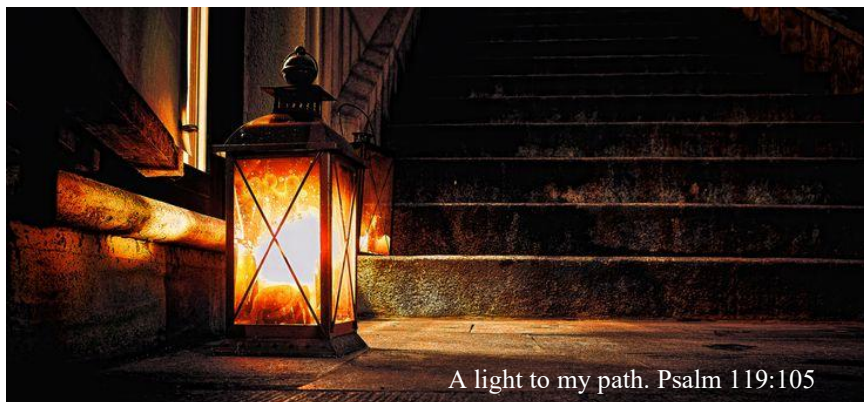




A light to my path. Psalm 119:105

Be Content

Discontentment arises from our financial situation when we believe there are barriers preventing us from achieving our career goals. Other situations include discontentment with our spouse, health conditions, or social circumstances. The Apostle Paul said he had learned to be content regardless of his circumstances, and he had experienced some hard conditions (Philippians 4:11-12, NKJV). Jesus said we should not worry about anything in our life, including food or clothing, because God knows what we need and can provide it (Matthew 6:25, 32). Most often discontentment results from covetousness, which is a desire to have what another has (Hebrews 13:5-6). King Solomon also knew discontent. He was wealthy in silver and not satisfied (Ecclesiastes 5:10). The Apostles James and Paul knew that only the gifts from God would satisfy us (James 1:17; Romans 8:28). Paul's letter to Timothy tells us we are content when we have devotion toward and faith in God rather than material things (1 Timothy 6:6-7). The key to being content in any situation is knowing that God loves you with an everlasting love (Jeremiah 31:3). God showed how much he loves us when he came as Jesus, a man, to remove the state of sin we carried from Adam's disobedience (John 3:16; 1 John 4:9-10; Romans 5:8). Today, accept God's unconditional love, and he will remove your discontentment, giving you all you want and need (Matthew 6:33). Shalom!!
